EDTA Thespian Relief Grants - Informational slideshow

Many schools are struggling to keep their programs alive. Some lost significant revenue from cancelled productions. The Foundation is still raising money for this effort. Thespian Relief Grants are provided by The ETF Thespian Relief program. Two types of grants are offered to assist schools impacted by cancelled productions and budget cuts related to the COVID-19 crisis. Thespian Relief Grants will be offered in cycles through the course of the 2020-21 school year. Grants will be available and distributed monthly, though grant cycles may be longer depending on available funding. If you are in need, please know these resources are available: <u>apply here</u>.

THE THESPYS ARE COMING! THE THESPYS ARE COMING!

Last week you should have seen an email out with the instructions on registering and submitting for this year's Thespys. In addition to this information, you can find the updated 2020 - 2021 Thespy Program Guide, Summary of Changes for 2020 - 2021, Category Summary Guide, and all Event Rubrics on the Washington Thespian Website <u>http://www.washingtonstatethespians.com/virtual-thespys-20-21.php</u>. Technical Theatre Submissions

Filming your Thespys

To film your selections you will need to follow the National guidelines and the Washington State guidelines for Coronavirus County Safe Start. <u>https://coronavirus.wa.gov/what-you-need-know/county-status-and-safe-start-application-process</u>.

FILM THESPYS

This year, Film Thespys will be submitted with all other Thespys, due by February 12th and submitted through OpenWater. This is different from years' past, so be sure to share this with your students!

Some things you need to know:

- Film Submissions will count toward the 3 events your students may submit for.
- Students can submit for different film categories (for example, submit one "Short Film" and one "Documentary Film"); however, each will count toward the three total Thespy submissions allowed.
- These different categories are identified in the drop-down menu on the registration website.

EDTA IS EXPLORING A NEW STUDENT MEMBERSHIP MODEL
